Find top 5 usability issues with just 5 usability tests

## Top 5 with 5

#### The Goal:


Find the most critical usability issues quickly and efficiently.

#### The Plan:

Perform 5 usability tests and identify the most critical issues for a given workflow. Fix critical issues, rinse and repeat.

### The Rationale

Find about 80% of your usability issues by testing 5 users.

#### The Catch

- Most web sites and software applications have hundreds or thousand of features weaved into a wide array of workflow scenarios.
- Testing thousands of features with a single user is not possible.
- Top 5 with 5 is best used as an iterative testing method, testing individual workflows scenarios, improving the product 5 usability issues at a time.

## Example

App Services Orchestrator 1<sup>st</sup> round of Top 5 with 5 usability testing

- Tested 5 internal users
- Total duration 2 weeks

#### The Good News








Based on the current feature set of ASO. Running a single Top 5 with 5 usability test will likely cover 90% of the ASO's workflows

### The Plan

- Identify critical features and workflows
- Identify usability participants
- Recruit participants
- Perform usability tests
- Review the results

## Top 5 Usability Results

- Users kept right clicking on gateway explorer nodes to do things like edit and delete REST Proxies
- Accidentally deleted Gateway connection, when trying to delete the selected REST gateway
- Did not see the carrot that expands the soap operations rows in the "Choose Operations" section
- Could not edit or delete existing rest proxy configurations
- During install we confuse users by providing too many placement options for the ASO shortcut location, only to provide a shortcut that does nothing
